Strengthening hunting and outdoor living skills is a continual process. SCI and SCIF have a variety of programs and activities new hunters can participate in designed to help them become a better hunter conservationist. The Apprentice Hunter Program is one program that gives hands-on experience. SCIF recommends two sites for Apprentice Hunter camps: The Willow Lake Sportsman's Club in Three Rivers, Michigan (www.willowlakesportsmansclub.com) and Indianhead Ranch near Del Rio, Texas (www.indianheadranch.com).

Another program that gives valuable hands-on learning experience is SCIF's American Wilderness Leadership School (AWLS). AWLS is not a traditional school, as it is nestled in the mountains near Jackson Hole, Wyoming and surrounded by more than 8 million acres of public land. After a firearm safety class, students can try shotguns on a trap course, as well as pistols and rifles at a range located on the school grounds. Archery classes and a 12 station 3D target course are also available.

A highlight for many of the students is a hike into a secluded area of the mountains for an overnight experience. They sleep in the woods under a shelter they build with provided materials. Another highlight of the eight-day experience is the exciting whitewater float trip down the Snake River.
